Per The Guardian: new study shows Horses can recognize human emotions. Psychologists at Sussex University, have shown for the first time that horses are able to distinguish between positive and negative human facial. "What's really interesting about this research is that it shows horses have the ability to read emotions across the species barrier. We have known – horses are a socially sophisticated species –they can distinguish between positive and negative human facial expressions," said Amy Smith, a doctoral student in the university's mammal vocal communication and cognition research group.
