ALSO WE HAVE A STUMP PROJECT! Would you like to buy a stump! The bottom pasture was logged several years ago and the stumps were left, which means it doesn't make a good pasture. The need is to have the stumps removed to make a pasture for the recovering horses. This would also allow us to use the top pasture for hay. It's a project to help the horses and to have future hay. The problem is getting the excavator (rent?) and proficient driver. Please consider a donation (\$40) to help us clear out the stumps and make the ground horse friendly. To make the upper pasture a place to grow our own hay is to help sustain the rescue for future hay for the horses. We try to put up 80 to 100 ton a year. If we could put some of our own land to use for this it would be very beneficial.
