Teddy (also known as "Teddy Bear") was found wandering the streets of Lebanon in September of 2021. Animal Control picked him up and he was later adopted by LCAR as part of our hospice dog program. When he first arrived Teddy was very timid and often hid from others; buried under blankets and wedged in the back corner of his dog house. Blind in one eye and fearful of his surroundings he would often growl and snap at people when they tried to get him to come out.

Despite Teddy's standoffish behavior, everyone at LCAR quickly grew attached to him. Tawni and John, two of our volunteers, worked with him on socialization and getting comfortable with his new surroundings. It took some time and plenty of patience from all involved, but now Teddy loves the company of others and could be considered a certifiable lapdog. He enjoys car rides, outings to the store and long on-leash walks.
